NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED MARCH 31, 2004

1. PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIZATION

The Weston King Neighbourhood Centre was incorporated on January 17, 2003 without share capital under the laws of the Province of Ontario and qualifies as a non-profit organization under the provisions of the Income Tax Act (Canada). The Centre oversees the following program in the City of Toronto. AIDS/HIV Harm Reduction Program

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Revenue Recognition

Weston King Neighbourhood Centre follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

Fixed Assets

All additions to fixed assets exceeding \$5,000 are capitalized and depreciated on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful life of the asset. All other additions are expensed as inccurred.

Donation Services

Management has adopted the policy of recording the value of rent as Donation In Kind. The Centre continues to receive rental space from Central United Church.

3. RESTRICTIONS ON NET ASSETS

The Weston King Neighbourhood Centre Board of Directors has no restrictions on net surplus.
